SHIBORI & BATIK DYEING! (AGES 15+)

Learn the exciting ins and outs of indigo dyeing using batik and shibori resists! In this class we will explore shibori dyeing with indigo creating traditional and modern designs. We will also learn how to batik dye using beeswax to create more painterly designs. As well as exploring the endless ranges of blues indigo can offer on a variety of fabrics, as well as maintaining your own vat.
